

# **2024 REPORTS**

#### **Understanding Your Child's Report**

You will receive two academic reports this year. A 'Mid Year Report' at the end of Semester 1 and an 'End of Year Report' at the end of Semester 2.

#### Mid Year Report

This report provides parents with a 'snapshot in time' of how their child is progressing in relation to the end of year achievement standard for each learning area for their year level. The grade provided is taking into account the curriculum which has been taught and assessed to that point in time.

#### **End of Year Report**

This report provides parents with an overview of how their child has progressed, across the entire year, in relation to the end of year Achievement Standard for each learning area for their year level. The grade provided is taking into account the curriculum which has been taught and assessed across the entire year, not just Semester 2.

In line with School Curriculum and Standards Authority (SCSA) requirements, the reports will not list some of the outcomes that your child has been working towards in class. However, we encourage you to look at the Term Overviews, sent out at the start of each term, and Seesaw for what your child has been learning about.

#### Understanding the Five Step Grading System (A-E)

- 'C' Grade indicates that your child has progressed to the desired level of understanding for their year level.
- 'C' Grade is the expected Achievement Standard for each year level and each Learning Area.
- 'A' Grade or 'B' Grade means that your child is responding to the content taught to a deeper level. They may be thinking more critically about the content, which is a wonderful skill to demonstrate.
- Final grades are determined by teachers collecting numerous samples of work and assessments.

  The grade is determined with the use of SCSA Judging Standards.
- 'D' and 'E' Grades reflect limited to very low achievement of what is expected for their year level. Your child's teacher will arrange a time to discuss their progress if they are receiving either of these grades.

#### Pre-primary

Pre-primary reports are still graded on a 5-step scale, however, the steps use achievement descriptors rather than grades. The descriptors include Excellent (A-grade), High (B-grade), Satisfactory (C-grade), Limited (D-grade) & Very Low (E-grade).

Reports go live to parents on SEQTA on Tuesday 25 June. We hope this information assists you to understand the reporting process at St Michael's School. If you have any further questions, please do not hesitate to ask your child's teacher.

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

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#### CHORES FOR KIDS: TRIPLE P'S TIPS FOR ALL AGES

Chores are more than just helping around the home. They help kids develop life skills, like cooperation, empathy, time-management, responsibility and perseverance. Chores also give kids a feeling of independence and accomplishment, which boosts their confidence.

As a parent or carer, positive strategies can encourage kids to pitch in. Planning, involving kids in decisions, breaking things down into smaller tasks, giving plenty of praise and using incentives can be great motivators.

It can help to think about what children could do independently, or with a little guidance, keeping in mind it may take time for them to learn how to do the job. For toddlers and young children, chores can be simple. As they grow older, they can become more complex. The key is to give them opportunities to help as soon as they're ready, to show them the steps, and be patient while they learn.

Even when kids don't do things exactly how we want them to, giving them the space and time to try shows them their contribution is valued. What really matters is encouraging their participation, not perfection.

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Our Before, After School and Holiday programs are designed to support school communities and busy families. We provide an engaging and educational environment for children to form friendships, learn life skills and prepare them for life beyond the classroom.

Since July 10 2023, families who earn less than \$530,000pa are eligible for the Child Care Subsidy with up to 90% off fees! This means even more families can access quality programs such as our 'Rise then Shine' before school program, 'Stay and Play' after school program, and our Holiday HQ School Holiday programs at a very affordable rate. On average, our families get a 76% rebate on all sessions.

All of our 460+ services across Australia are registered and approved by the Australian Government to ensure parents at our services can access CCS.

### What if I don't currently get CCS and want to apply?

If your family earns under \$530,000 and meets the following requirements, you are eligible for the Child Care Subsidy (CCS).

You or your partner must meet all of the following:

- care for your child at least 2 nights per fortnight, or have 14% care
- are liable for fees for care provided at an approved child care service. Every centre we run across Australia is registered and approved by the Australian Government
- · meet the residence rules.

Your child must also meet both of these:

- · immunisation requirements
- not be attending secondary school unless an exemption applies.

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#### How much can I get?

The Child Care Subsidy amount you're eligible for will be based on the following:

- · your family's income
- the hourly rate cap based on the type of approved child care you use and your child's age
- · the hours of activity you and your partner do
- the number of children in your care. The amount of subsidised childcare you can access per fortnight applies to each child.

You can use this Payment and Service Finder to estimate how much Child Care Subsidy (CCS) you may get.

#### How do I make a claim?

You need to set aside about 30 minutes to do the following:

- Create a MyGov account and link it to Centrelink. If you've claimed a payment before, you can use your Centrelink Customer Reference Number (CRN) to link Centrelink to myGov.
- Provide your identity. You can do this by providing one document from each of the following lists:
  - Australian birth certificate, Australian citizenship certificate, Australian passport, Australian Visa
  - Australian driver license, Australian Certificate of Registration by Descent, ImmiCard
  - You may also need to enter some details from your Medicare card.
- 3.As you complete your claim, you may asked for certain documents or information. These will show as required in your claim. Documents may include:
  - Tax File Number, child's birth certificate, financial records, employment details (payslip) Health Card, relationship status, residence details if you have lived outside of Australia
- 4. Confirm your enrolment by asking your childcare service for your enrolment details then confirm them by using your Centrelink online account through myGov. Select Family from the menu, followed by Child Care then Enrolments.

#### What happens next?

Once your claim has been processed you will receive an Assessment Notice either by regular mail or via your MyGov Inbox.

The Assessment Notice will inform you of the following:

- · if you're eligible
- · the childcare fee assistance you'll receive
- · the annual cap that applies to you
- · the withholding amount.

If you are eligible, the payment will be automatically applied to the fees billed by your childcare service. You don't have to do anything else.

It is your responsibility to then keep your information up to date. You can do this by regularly checking your details are correct in MyGov and tell them if:

- · your family's income changes
- your or your partner's activity levels change
- · your relationship status changes
- there are any other changes to your or your partner's circumstances.

Your information about your family circumstances needs to be accurate so you receive the correct amount of CCS.
